

CLUB NOTES

Good evening, everybody; and a very warm welcome to you all for this our opening match of another new season. As in previous years we have the opportunity of entertaining clubs from the Football League, and this evening's fixture against our guests from CRYSTAL PALACE will prove a really valuable test for the Magpies. I am sure that you will join me in offering a sincere welcome to the players and officials of the Palace. This is the second match of their pre-season tour of Devon and Cornwall — last night they were at Falmouth Town, and they are due to meet Bideford on Friday.

THE 1970/71 SEASON

Last season, although finishing in twelfth place, our South-western League side made great progress and the signs are that this improvement will continue during the coming year. The most pleasing feature of the season was the tremendous team spirit which was evident throughout the entire Club. Although we have some very talented individuals, many of our best results were achieved not by one player's sudden flash of brilliance, but by team-work, enthusiasm and selfless running. On paper, of course, our best result was an 8–2 victory over Wadebridge. There were, however, several less clearcut wins in which the team really hit its peak. Our most satisfactory victory was probably our 1–0 result at Twistock in the second leg of the League Cup Second Round tie. As many of you will regal, Tavistock had gained a 3–2 lead through the first leg here at Penlee, but in the return the Magpies showed all their character to draw level on aggregate. The decider, again at Penlee, produced another fine display and a 4–1 victory. Our three matches against Falmouth Town also brought the best out of the boys and, although we finished on the losing side on each occasion (0–1, 2–3, 1–3), these were three of the hardest games Falmouth had all season.

The Combination League side struggled for most of the season and were unable to build a settled team due to the calls of the South-western League side. Several players came up into the S.W.L. side and performed with great distinction. This coming season, of course, will see us again competing in the County Youth Competitions and the West Penwith League, and it is hoped that this will create greater reserves of strength throughout the Club.

OUR VISITORS THIS EVENING

PAUL HAMMOND: Signed for Palace in January and has quickly established himself as a reliable goalkeeper. Aged 18, he comes from Nottingham, and was recently elected "Player of the Tournament" when Palace Juniors played in Roubaix, France.

STEVE WOOLDRIDGE: Joined Palace in August, 1965, as an amateur and became an Apprentice a year later. A regular member of the Reserve side but has yet to make his League debut. Spent three months on loan to Plymouth Argyle last season, making 22 first team appearances. Gained schoolboy representative honours for West London and London.

BILL ROFFEY: A player who has made great progress during the past season, it is hoped that he will soon be challenging for a League place. Still only 17, he has the build to become a really strong player. Represented South London Schools before signing Apprentice in April, 1970. Turned professional in May of this year.

BOB GOLDTHORPE: 20-year-old stalwart of the Reserve side. Strong and dependable id has high hopes of breaking into the League side before long. A product of the Palace Youth scheme, he is one of several players to come from West London and represented Hounslow Schools before signing as a Professional in July, 1968.

MICHAEL BROWN: Swansea born, was spotted by a Palace scout when playing for Swansea and Wales Schoolboys. Signed Apprentice in August, 1968, and Professional in September, 1969. He was a member of the Welsh Youth team that beat England in the 1970 International Youth Tournament and has four Youth Caps. 19 years old.

DAVID MANN: A tenacious and talented player equally at home as wing half or inside forward. Had a notable career as a schoolboy, playing for South London, London, Surrey and the South of England. Also had trials for the F.A. Youth side. Born in South London, he signed Apprentice on leaving school in July, 1968, and became a full Professional in July, 1970. 18 years old.

GRAHAM THOMAS: Born at Eastbourne, he played for Hastings and Eastbourne Schools and has also had experience with Eastbourne Town in the Athenian League. Now 18, he has played regularly for Palace Reserves on the wing.

ROSS JENKINS: Another West London boy, Ross is unusually tall for an inside forward. Aged 19, he has been a regular member of the Reserve side. Played as a schoolboy for Richmond and London Schools, signing Apprentice in July, 1968, and full Professional in November, 1969.

ALAN PINKNEY: Battersea-born, Alan was originally a schoolboy player with Palace. Played for London (captain) and England Grammar Schools. Qualified as a P.E. Instructor and, whilst at St. Luke's College, played 9 games for Exeter City including their third Rours' F.A. Cup-tie against Manchester United in 1969. Signed Professional for Palace on return to London in July, 1969. Has made four League and Cup games, and also playedor. Palace's great win over Inter-Milan the Italian Champions at San Siro in the Anglo-Italian Tournament in June. Illness and injury kept him on the side-lines for a large part of last season, but he is now fully recovered and hoping for a good season. Age 24.

GERRY HUMPHRIES: Born at Llandudno, he made nine appearances for the Welsh Schoolboy team and since then has gained ten Under-23 caps. Signed for Everton on leaving school and made twelve First Division appearance, scoring twice. Transferred to Palace in May, 1970, he has played fourteen First team matches. Aged 25, he is equally at home in mid-field or on the wing.

MARTIN HINSHELWOOD: Born in Croydon and another product of the Palace Youth side, Martin signed as an Apprentice in November, 1969, after playing for Croydon and Surrey Schools. Became a full Professional in August last year and had a very successful season in the Reserve side last season. 18 years old.

VIC PAIN: Another local boy who has recently signed Professional after a year as an Apprentice. Played for South London Schools as well as Surrey and the London Youth side. 18 years old.

JIM CANNON: Glasgow-born lad who recently turned Professional after fifteen months as an Apprentice. A strong centre-half, he captained the successful Palace Under-17 side last season.

GRAHAM MORRIS: A local lad who has only recently signed as an Apprentice, but has made rapid progress. 17-year-old forward who played for the Surrey Youth side last year.

LEN PRINCE: 17-year-old Sunderland-born lad who signed Professional forms last month, following a year as an Apprentice. Plays in the defence.

KEITH WALLEY: Apprentice forward who has been with the Club for a year. Not yet 17, he is making good progress. Weymouth-born.

THE PALACE OFFICIALS

TERRY LONG (Trainer/Coach): Has been with the Club for 16 years, having signed from Wycombe Wanderers in May, 1955. Holds the Club record of 432 League and Cup appearances. His most vivid memory is of a goal he scored against Real Madrid in April, 1962. Palace lost the match 3-4, but the Real side included Puskas, di Stefano, Gento and Santamaria!

PETER BARNES (Assistant Secretary): Joined the Club in the summer of 1969 following Palace's promotion to the First Division.

I am certain that the Referee and Linesmen here tonight need little introduction. They are regularly seen on our ground and to all three we offer greetings.


To tonight's Referee, Harry Heath, we also offer our congratulations on the recent award of the British Empire Medal.

BIG NAMES AT PENZANCE

Tonight's match against Palace will be the first visit here from a Football League club since the pre-season friendly with Torquay United on 26th July, 1969. On that occasion after holding our Third Division opponents to a goalless scoreline at the interval, we finally went down 0-6 after a very entertaining encounter. In previous seasons, of course, it was quite usual for League clubs to visit Penzance prior to the opening of a new season, and doubtless many of you will recall games against Exeter, Tottenham, West Ham, Luton, Swansea, etc.

In this modern age, of course, it is as easy for an "up-country" club to visit the Continent as travel to Cornwall, and we are indeed fortunate to have the opportunity of meeting Crystal Palace and Bournemouth this year.

As far as I am aware, these matches represent the best pre-season build-up of any club in Cornwall, and I am sure that the valuable experience the boys will gain from these games will pay dividends when we begin our South-western League programme on 14th August.


PROSPECTS FOR THE COMING SEASON
